Whether excused or unexcused, missing too much school has detrimental effects on a student's learning trajectory.

Revisions Effective July 1, 2023 to the Operating Standards for Children With Disabilities

This includes the rules with the developmental disabilities expansion language that are currently in the rule revision process which include the following sections: *Applicability of requirements and definitions, Child Find, Evaluations and Transportation*. All other parts of these four rules and their revisions are in effect. OCALI's Lending Library and the Outreach Center for Deafness and Blindness are excited to announce that FM/DM devices are now available to borrow for FREE! These devices can provide greater access to learners who are deaf/hard of hearing or to students who need additional support for listening.

With more than 30 available, it's easier than ever to compare different models or try before buying. These devices are provided for licensed audiologists in the state of Ohio. If you are a parent, caregiver, or guardian, you can reach out to your child's teacher or audiologist to request access.

To access these FM/DM devices, you must:

- Register with a free Lending Library account
- Be a licensed audiologist
- · Reside in the state of Ohio
